This month recipe calls for that leftover cranberry sauce you've been wondering what to do with!



CRANBERRY SAUCE SQUARES.

1/2 cup butter, softened 2 tsp icing sugar 1 cup flour 2 eggs 1 cup sugar 1/3 cup flour

1 tsp baking powder 1/4 tsp salt 1 tsp Almond flavouring 1/3 cup chopped raisins 1/3 cup chop almonds 1./3 cup coconut 2/3 cup cranberry sauce

- 1. Mix butter, icing sugan and 1 cup flour and spread over bottom of a greased 9x13" pan.
- 2. Beat eggs, add sugar, 1/3 cup flour, baking powder, salt, almond flavouring and mix well. Stir in raisins, almonds, coconut and cranberry sauce.
- 3. Spread the cranberry mixture over crust. Bake at 350 deg. for 40 minutes. Cool on rack.




